The decrease is likely due to the fact that larger employers started paying the Apprenticeship levy in April and so some have intentionally delayed recruiting apprentices so that they can use utilise their levy. Amber rating is because although Oxfordshire is doing better compared with the SE and national figures, the 525 city deal target will not be achieved (data is time lagged and so we won't have data for the final 2 months of the financial year until August).
